Current situation

- Marine industries make a significant contribution to the UK economy
- Environment needs protecting and improving
- Extensive experience of working with legislation and regulators

Future goals for environment and economy



- Economy: Need for economic growth to meet UK targets for energy, climate change etc
 - Offshore wind will play a key
- Social: Better alignment of socio-economic targets to parallel environmental targets? Coastal towns are some of the most deprived areas in the country
- Environment: 25 year Environment Plan, ecosystem services, net gain and natural capital all have a role in planning and delivering work



Net Gain and SUDG - where are we?

- Net gain will be mandatory
 - Town and country Planning Act
 - Environment Act
- Marine and coastal environments need restoring
- Marine industries have strong experience in delivering environmental solutions
- Regulation should be proportionate and targeted to deliver environmental outcomes
- Net gain should be a real opportunity to deliver restoration





Net Gain and SUDG -

- Marine industries support net gain
 - We need to maintain that positive support
- Net gain should be a real opportunity to deliver restoration
 - Not packages of 'greenwash'
- Best done through innovation, not complex regulation
 - Keep it simple
- Better to collaborate on how to plan and deliver net gain
 - The importance of partnership working





Net Gain and SUDG:

- Mitigation hierarchy remains essential
 - Not looking for changes in the law
- Net gain could be linked to the mitigation hierarchy
 - ecosystem enhancement or 'compensation plus'
- Avoid constraints of additionality
 - Many industry developments will be in or near MPAs
- Deliver best environmental outcomes
- Avoid unnecessary and complex regulation



Net Gain and SUDG

- Identify and agree national targets for net gain
 - Task and finish group
- Use these to direct approaches for delivery of net gain
- Currently preparing bid to look more locally

- SUDG industries are critical to marine and UK economy
